

### **Busy Eco Gardeners**

The Horticultural team have had a very busy start to the new term with numerous sites around the school being maintained and developed. The Eco garden has had to be managed after a long summer of growth with weeding, clearing and planting of new wild flower beds and display containers. Several of the boys have also been taking part in a community project at Morgan Jones' park where they have helped volunteers and families build green houses, raised beds and carried out an array of seasonal planting. All boys are on target to gain a Level 1 BTEC qualification in Land Use studies.

# **Students Contribute to Community Allotments**

Five students have assisted at Morgan Jones Community Allotments over the past few months. The project offers the local community the chance to learn how to grow vegetables and run a garden while looking after wildlife, all in a casual and friendly environment.

The five students involved have included: Liam Stone, Liam Davies, Jack Pittard, Kieran Clarke, Ian Jones

Since taking part, they have achieved the following tasks, either independently or supporting other volunteers:

- Constructing a tool rack from reclaimed pallet wood to better organise the shed (done independently)
- Building a new large growing bed, including excavating turf and assembling wooden edging using power tools (independently)
- Moving compost using wheelbarrows to top up our supplies (independently)
- Gathering leaves (and clearing public pathways at the same time) to make leaf mould compost for next year
- Laying a weed barrier in the greenhouse and arranging planters inside for next year's produce (independently)
- Sowing peas and beans for next year
- Meeting and representing themselves and St. Martin's School during Hefin David AM's visit in October
- Learning and practising safe and effective fire-lighting and cooking popcorn over the fire
- Helping in the creation of the project sign

I'm pleased to say that they've been wonderful members of the project. They're attitude to getting stuck in and producing something of their own while keeping in mind the ongoing direction of the allotments as a community resource has really inspired me. I value their dedication and willingness to learn. They've embraced 100% while with the group, even attending during half-term on one occasion.
