## Unites Kingdom Maths Trust Maths Miniatures 2018 competition.

Maths Miniatures is a short film competition for schools and colleges across the UK organised jointly by UKMT, MathsWorldUK, and the University of Leeds.

The brief was to produce a film describing Mathematics in the Natural World. The Task was to submit a video lasting 3 minutes or less, in which the students explore mathematics in the natural world. The video needed to include:

- The chosen feature(s) and where it's found in the natural world
- A clear explanation of the mathematics.

Several groups of Year 8 students created short films. The strongest group we entered into the national competition. See photo above. The students chose to discuss the Fibonacci sequence and where it is found in the natural world. The feedback from the competition adjudicators was very positive stating that the video was very interesting and enjoyable.
