Thank you to the Technocamps team from the University of South Wales who have been working with our code club enthusiasts this half term to deliver the "Smart City" initiative. Students were set the challenge in January to create a piece of software using the 'Smart Cities' theme. Our participants were split into two groups - group 1 created a healthy eating / wellbeing app called "Sportaneous", whilst group 2 created a virtual world of the future using scratch.

After weeks of hard work, our entries were submitted just last week so we await the results of the competition. Fingers crossed for both teams who were highly creative and showed the upmost dedication to ensure their aims were met every week.

Plastic Pollution Supermarket Improvement Plans

In English, class 7S have been learning about plastic pollution. We conducted a lot of research and have written Supermarket Improvement Plans. The idea is to reduce the amount of single-use plastic in supermarkets and schools.

We gave suggestions such as using gravity dispensers for package-free pasta and rice, and eliminating plastic packaging on fruit and vegetables. We will send our plans, plus a persuasive covering letter, to supermarkets (such as Tesco and Asda) to make this an authentic learning experience.

While most students wrote theirs to high performing supermarkets, others wrote to the school to complain about the plastic use and lack of recycling facilities at St Martin's. The persuasive letter acted as our most recent writing assessment, but hopefully it will change the way plastic is used in supermarkets too!

Brilliant Club

We are once again working in collaboration with the Brilliant Club and this year we will be giving two cohorts of more able and talented year 7 and 9 students the opportunity to take part in the scholars programme.

The Brilliant Club is an award-winning university access charity that works with schools and universities across the UK and exists to both provide opportunities for more able pupils whilst increasing the number of pupils from under-represented backgrounds progressing to highly selective universities. The Scholars Programme recruits, trains and places doctoral and postdoctoral researchers in schools to deliver programmes of university-style tutorials, which are supplemented by two university trips.

This term our year 9 students welcomed the opportunity to visit Bath University for their launch trip and have now completed two seminars with their Cardiff University tutor. They are focusing on the topic of "The benefits of shared decision making and joint consultation in teenage healthcare." Students will research this topic in depth and will each write a 2000 word assignment which will be assessed using undergraduate criteria.

The tutor has commented that all our students are "highly engaged and enthusiastic." Oliver Skinner, year 9, stated that to date he is finding the programme "A very beneficial and worthwhile experience."

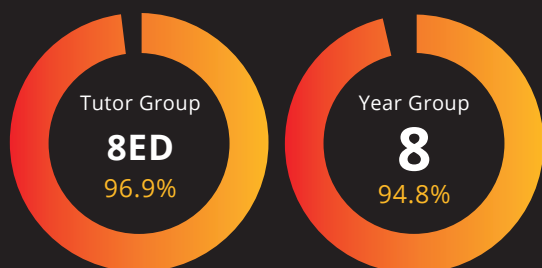
We are looking forward to our year 7 launch trip and the opportunity to stretch and challenge more of our young learners outside of the classroom environment.

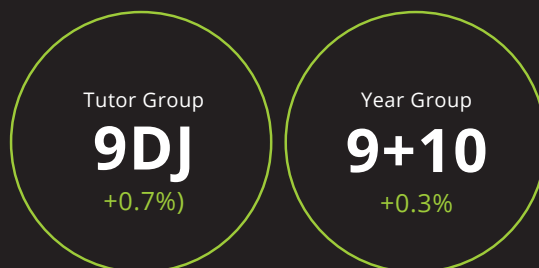


Attendance to date - ending 08.02.2019

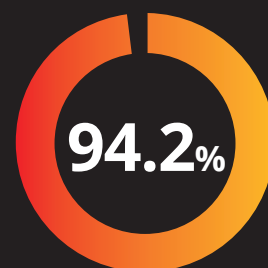
Highest

The maths department have celebrated a fantastic set of results from the November sitting.

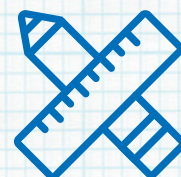
88% of those students who sat the exam achieved A* - C and 100% A* - G.

Year 7 and 8 enjoyed a judo taster session with Judo club attendees leading the demonstration.

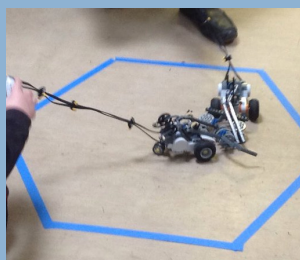
