NEWS UPDATE FROM THE HEADTEACHER September 2019

We look forward to a successful year for all our learners and the ongoing partnership working to achieve this.

Our aim is the success and excellence of every pupil in every year group, so that all our learners achieve results that enable them to go on to future success, and become ambitious, capable learners.

The support and commitment of parents and carers to the education of your children is crucial to our success. I know we have your continued support in ensuring your children succeed and excel now and in the future.

I am very pleased with how our new learners have settled in and look forward to meeting parents and carers at events throughout the year.

GCSE RESULTS - KEY STAGE 4

Congratulations to our Year 11 students of 2019 on attaining another exceptional year of results. 174 students, equating to 85.6% of those sitting GCSEs this year attained 5 A* - C Grades C compared to 72.7% in 2018. The capped 9 points score rose this year to 403.21.

More students than ever before attained 5 GCSEs at A* and A with 27% of all those entered achieving this accolade compared to 17% in 2018.

The Global Communications Faculty attained the highest results ever with 82.1% achieving a C or above in English.

For students studying Mathematics, which has long been a strong performing subject within the school, attainment was high once again this year and above Welsh government modelled expectations with 78.7% of students achieving a C or above. This was also exemplified in the achievement of 37 Year 11 students who sat Mathematics A level alongside their GCSEs, of which 27 gained a passes ranging from A - C. These talented individuals will no doubt be our future engineers, scientists and mathematical theorists. Well done to all. The subject of Mathematics has laid the preparations for future success within the schools Sixth Form Centre. 43 students were also entered for additional mathematics with 72% attaining an A* or A grade.

Science results were also the highest ever in the school's history with 77% of students gaining a C or above compared to 60.9% in 2018.

Congratulations to the students and staff of St. Martin's who have worked tirelessly to attain such impressive results and thank you to all parents who have worked in such close partnership with us throughout the years. I look forward to welcoming these into the Sixth Form.

Year 11 learners have a portfolio of qualifications to present to future employers, our Sixth Form, Colleges and Universities. We are very proud of their results and hard work.

A LEVEL RESULTS - KEY STAGE 5

Exceptional outcomes have been achieved at St. Martin's Sixth Form Centre once again as the school continues to go from strength to strength. As a growing sixth form provider within Caerphilly with a total of 118 learners, strong academic success and impressive facilities we are proud to announce that 92% of learners have achieved the level 3 threshold of 2A level passes this year. The number of learners attaining 3 A*-C also rose by 7% to 62% of the year group. There was 100% pass rate in 19 out of the 21 subjects studied by students this year.

All students have obtained the grades required to progress onto their diverse higher education courses, chosen career pathways, apprenticeships and work placements.

The leaders of our Sixth Form, Miss Hopkins and Miss McCallion stated, "It is wonderful to be leading the school's Sixth Form Centre, which is at the heart of our community and so highly regarded within the area as *a* leading provider of Post-16 courses."

The governing body are highly supportive and have heavily invested in the facilities at the school which have been further enhanced this year by the creation of larger spaces for independent study and reflection. The highly skilled and experienced Sixth Form team of teachers provides quality provision within small class sizes which gives our students personalised support and guidance at such a critical time in their lives.

Providing personalised tutoring, within small class sizes enables teachers to give our students the individual attention and guidance that they require at this stage in their lives when they are studying at such a high level. Coupling this with the impressive facilities available to all learners are the key ingredients for success at this level.

GCSE EARLY ENTRIES

A congratulations must also be given to all those learners who sat their GCSE examinations early last year. We very much look forward to seeing their final results next year.

SCHOOL RECEPTION

We have taken into consideration the views of learners, parents, carers and the local community, and made the decision to move our main school reception. This is now located in the old sixth form block by the double red doors.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP OF LEARNERS

Parents and Carers please note the school car park is for the school staff and visitor parking only. The school car park is very busy at the start and end of the day and cannot accommodate parents' cars.

Kindly note we do not have scope for parents to pick up and drop off your children in the school car park. Please make arrangements to meet your child outside of the school grounds and car park.

START OF YEAR THINGS TO NOTE

Please note the following minimum expectations of St. Martin's School.

Pupil Punctuation: School starts promptly at 8.30am. Learners need to be in lesson 1 by this time. Late marks are issued where this is an issue and parents are informed. Learners will be expected to make up missed time through lateness.

Pupil Attendance: Learners are required to be in school 100% of the time. Governors and I want all parents / carers to aim for this. Parents / carers are asked to make medical and dental appointments outside of the school day as far as is possible. If this is unavoidable due to emergency, please return your child to school as soon as possible to gain their registration mark and resume learning.

School Absence Line: We operate a school absence line, which you can come through to on telephoning school. If your child is absent, please telephone the absence line on the day of absence. This counts as an absence record and you will not need to send in a note.

Learners leaving school site: Learners remain on site all day. They are only allowed to leave our school site for a specific reason and after being signed out at our school office. If a child needs to leave school for any reason during the school day, for your child's safety he / she will not be allowed to wait outside school. Parents / carers must come into reception, where your child will be signed out and passed to your safekeeping.

Mobile phones: Learners are allowed to carry mobile phones to and from school for their personal safety. We want you to be able to contact them, and them you, before and after school if necessary. However, learners are not allowed to use these phones in school under any circumstances. Phones must be kept in pupil bags throughout the day.

Any messages parents / carers leave on your child's mobile phone should not be picked up until the end of the school day when learners have left site. Please phone the school office to pass on any urgent messages for your child during the school day. This will be passed on by a member of our office staff.

Mobile phones used by pupils in school will be automatically confiscated and will need to be collected by a parent or other authorised adult from reception.

School Uniform: Our uniform list and stockists are listed in our school planner. We do not accept variations on uniform bought in other places and we will ask parents to change aspects of uniform where this is inappropriate. If in doubt regarding an aspect of uniform, parents please check with the school before purchase.

We continue our strong tradition of excellence, in pupil examination results and in all the experiences we offer our learners. We expect to continue this excellence with your children over this next year so that each one of them learns together and achieves forever.
