The Big Sleep Out

On Friday 31st January 2020, 19 students took on the challenge of 'sleeping rough' for the night at St Martin's School, Caerphilly. They did this as part of their Welsh Baccalaureate project in an attempt to raise money and awareness for the homeless.

As part of the challenge, students walked three miles in the dark and rain in order to try and experience the average ten miles a homeless person walks a day to find food and shelter. Students worked as teams to build their shelters for the night and watched two short documentaries regarding homelessness in the UK. They also had basic soup and roll rations in line with a typical soup kitchen meal. Students were asked to write a reflection following the experience and shared that 'the most difficult thing was how cold it was' and 'everyone deserves a home'. One student noted that their 'opinion on homeless people has changed entirely' and that they 'feel sorry for those people who have to do this every night'.

Students were a credit to themselves and the school and took on this challenge wholeheartedly with dignity, respect and care. They raised an incredible £733.28 which has exceeded the initial target of £500. With that in mind we have now extended our target to £1000. If you would like to donate you can do so here:



Careers Fayre

On December 17th, St Martin's held its very first Science Careers Fayre for pupils in Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5. Guest speakers were invited from all Science professions to present at the fayre. Some of the speakers included Aneurin Bevan UHB Midwifery Department, Cardiff School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, Institute of Physics specialising in Quantum Technologies and past pupils who have pursued careers in Chemistry, Microbiology, Marine Biology and Chiropractic treatment, to name a few.

The aim of the afternoon was to offer our pupils some extra guidance and support to aid the decision making process in relation to degree or career choices and to promote careers in STEM. Feedback from pupils and visitors was very positive with some pupils stating that this opportunity has made them consider a career path that they had not previously considered.

Due to the success of the event, the careers fayre will run next year and guest speakers have already agreed to return. **Roll on the 2020 Science Careers Fayre!**

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Operating Theatre Live at St Martin's





On Friday 7th February, 60 Year 8 pupils had the fantastic opportunity to experience the UK's leading dissection-based surgical workshop run by the award winning Operating Theatre Live. The company rose to success after securing an investment from Peter Jones and Deborah Meaden. The pupils participated in the 'Inspiring a doctor' programme which offers a curriculum linked learning experience based around the dissection of real anatomical specimens in an authentic operating theatre. The aim of the experience was to raise aspirations through inspiration and encourage pupils to consider a potential career in health, biosciences or any other discipline requiring a knowledge of anatomy and how the body works.

The workshop gave pupils an introduction to medicine and healthcare as a career. Pupils came to understand the vital importance of patient care while developing their communication skills through the replication of interview techniques. Pupils explored the differences in communicable and non-communicable diseases and how pathogens spread infection and gained important knowledge on infection control.

Pupils identified the CNS/PNS to understand how local and general anaesthetics function. Pupils used their numerical skills to prepare stock solutions of Propofol anaesthetic to provided concentrations before administering the correct dosage using the IV method. They focused on the practical execution of working in a lab when using the balances, volumetric flask and measuring cylinders.

Pupils explored human anatomy through the dissection of real anatomical specimens and developed their understanding of the main terminology used when navigating the human body. Pupils began by removing and dissecting the brain and spinal cord as well as isolating the eye to dissect the optic nerve and lens. Here they learnt to appreciate the role these parts play as a light receptor and sensory nerve. Pupils intubated the trachea, lungs and diaphragm using surgical equipment to observe the mechanism of inhalation and exhalation. A real highlight of the day gave the pupils the opportunity to perform a real heart transplant correctly reconnecting the vessels to a new donor heart.

It was fantastic to see pupils who previously thought that a career in health or medicine was something 'they were not good enough for', absolutely flourish during the experience. The workshop made learning authentic and raised aspirations in our pupils. Pupils closed the day with the mindset that a career in this sector is something that is possible for them and not impossible.

Skills Enrichment Project

We recently launched our Skills Enrichment Project with Key Stage 3. During session one, learners got to experience a range of technology.

The follow up sessions will see students discussing ways they can use technology to 'change the world', promoting that "moonshot thinking." They will then present their idea to a team of industry experts and reflect on the skills used throughout the 3 sessions.

Huge thanks to Have a Go Wales and to Holly Lidbury, Educalis, NDEC for supporting this initiative and inspiring lots of pupils to think differently about technology.
