The polytunnel is part of the school's long-tem plan to build authentic learning experiences into its curriculum as Wales moves towards adopting it Curriculum for Wales in September 2022. There are plans to link the polytunnel with the school's restaurant, 'Class', and to the sustainable food shop which will be opening in September.

With trees donated by the Woodland Trust planted this year to improve drainage on its sports pitches, the polytunnel forms part of St Martin's site enhancements focused on improving the environment.
