FOREWARD

From the Chair of Governors

It gives me great pleasure to present this annual report to parents on behalf of the Governing Body of St Martin's School for 2020-21.

I began my report last year writing about unprecedented circumstances at the end of some of the most difficult months most of us had ever experienced and unaware that 2020/21 would turn out to be even more challenging!

Throughout the pandemic to date, all the teaching and support staff across the school have worked closely and tirelessly to always ensure the safety of pupils and staff and still maintain a high quality of education for all our children. Our staff have had to, at speed, learn to plan their lessons and teach online, adapt to Google Classroom, respond to the many updates from both the Welsh Government and Caerphilly County Borough Council, whilst still always ensuring the children are at the forefront of everything they do.

The academic year 2020-21 saw more great progress in pupil attainment.

- The percentage of pupils achieving the Level 2 threshold (5 GCSE's at grade A*-C) at 88.89% up from 87.82% in the previous year.
- The percentage of pupils achieving the Level 2+ threshold (5 GCSE's at grade A*- C inc. English/Welsh and Maths) at 77.12% (inc. English Literature) down from 79.49% in the previous year.
- The Capped 9 measure which focuses on Year 11 pupils' results from nine of the qualifications that a learner attains was 429.09 an increase from 413.18 in the previous year.
- Attainment in literacy and numeracy development which has always been a
 priority for St Martin's School has improved once again with the average points
 score for literacy being 46.51% and numeracy standing at 44.6% up from
 43.24% for literacy and in line for numeracy with last year's score being
 42.97%.

Once again in 2020-21 the schools site management team have managed to make outstanding improvements to the buildings and environment most notably.

- Creation of a new Drama room
- Refurbishment of Science rooms
- Refurbishment of reception
- School museum cataloguing of the school's history
- Erection of all-weather shelters
- Big Box Boyd 'Pay as you Can' shop continued preparations for opening
- New boiler fitted in the Old Building
- Repainting of corridors and new doors fitted
- Major electrical wiring works across the school site
- · Second phase of lighting replacement, energy saving
- 7 additional car parking spaces
- Marking up of new tennis courts and green metal fencing





- Remarking of all pitches
- Remarking of netball indoors and outdoors
- Caretaker storage / PE storage
- Creation of a new PE / Gym area
- Trees works along the perimeter

As we move forward into a new exciting academic year 2021/22 we look forward to the challenges and changes as these often bring new opportunities. The Governing body have a wide variety of transferable skills and experience with one common interest which is ensuring the best possible education for every single individual child in our school.

I have been a school Governor for 7 terms now and I never cease to be amazed by the hard work and dedication of pupils and staff at St Martins. They have once again responded brilliantly to what has been a difficult year for communities across Wales and I cannot thank them enough. The Governing Body has continued to meet throughout the year and every single governor also deserves real thanks for their continued commitment to the school. I hope you find this report useful and look forward to another year of academic excellence at St Martins.



WELSH LANGUAGE

Welsh is a compulsory subject in Key Stage Three and Four. All pupils undertake Welsh as a qualification. The Welsh language is promoted through the translation of many subject materials into Welsh. Welsh cultural experience is also provided through the school's Eisteddfod and Welsh trips, as well as designated Welsh culture lessons at Key Stage 3.



POLICIES - Maintained by the Governing body

Governors maintain a wide range of polices related to the school's work and our statutory obligations. The school has a digital tracker which it uses to track and update policies when necessary, these are in line with its statutory obligations. Governors have subsequently established a rolling programme of review for all policies. Governors review some policies on an annual basis. Policies are generally adopted in line with Local Authority guidelines. Copies of all policies are available from the school.

PROSPECTUS

The school prospectus is updated and approved by the Governing Body.

PROVISION OF TOILET FACILITIES

The school has toilet facilities in most of the school's buildings, accessible to pupils throughout the school day. The majority are on the ground floor, with several disabled toilets available. Pupils benefit from self-operating taps and hand driers in the main toilets. Toilet facilities are upgraded when possible. Toilets are cleaned throughout the day by the school's site staff and cleaners.



CURRICULUM STATEMENT

The school annually reviews the curriculum with the Governing body to reflect the changes of a developing national picture, local needs and the changing needs of the learners. The areas of learning mirror our curriculum structure.

- Our provision will give appropriate balance to the development of attitudes to learning, skills, knowledge and understanding.
- Every learner will have a challenging personalised curriculum designed around prior attainment data, student aspirations and future targets.
- All learners will develop skills for life, including literacy, numeracy & digital competency. St Martin's School is at the heart of the community and engages with local services and employers to meet local, national and international needs within the Careers and the World of Work framework.
- We will provide a wide range of teaching and learning experiences along with extra- curricular activities in order to develop all learners' individual pathways.
- We will support all Government policy, in particular, bilingualism and Cwricwlwm Cymreig.

CURRICULUM ORGANISATION

The curriculum runs on a two-week timetable containing 50 teaching periods and 10 core skills sessions which focus on student wellbeing, assemblies, literacy, numeracy, digital competency and Pixl Edge or Sweet. The Curriculum Policy outlines how the National Curriculum at Key Stage 3, Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 specifications are delivered.

CAREERS SUPPORT AND DEVELOPMENT

A Careers Wales advisor provides specialist advice to students through core skills sessions and individual careers interviews.



NEW STARTERS DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR

There are an increasing number of students transferring to the school mid-term. In order to manage this, a student who enters the school will be placed in the most appropriate set based upon transfer data. This may be affected by some classes being full. At the nearest half term review the new starter may move sets in line with all other learners if academic performance indicates this need.



ADDITIONAL LEARNING NEEDS

The education of children with additional learning needs is overseen by Mrs K Richards, the school's ALNCo (Additional Learning Needs Co-ordinator). Appropriate support is allocated to pupils as necessary. The L.A. provides resources to pupils designated as requiring specific additional support. Pupils are placed on the Additional Learning Needs Register and have an I.D.P. (Individual Development Plan). These are shared with all staff, and in turn they cater for pupils in their lesson planning. A small number of pupils are catered for in designated small teaching groups.

PUPILS WITH DISABILITIES

The school aims to provide a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum that is designed to challenge and support pupils of all abilities. This will ensure a rich and full educational experience for all students. The school believes that all pupils belong, are valued and have a right to learn regardless of needs or abilities. The school works towards the full participation of children with disabilities and/or learning difficulties in the curriculum and school life in general. However, we remain aware that there may be occasions when alternative provision may have to be made for practical reasons

LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN

Looked after children (LAC) are fully integrated in the school, according to ability. The school LAC co-coordinator is Mrs K Richards (ALNCo) and she oversees their wellbeing and progress and liaises with agencies, as necessary.



ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE

There is a small but growing number of pupils whose first language is not English. The school works closely with Gwent Ethnic Minority Service (GEMS) to meet their needs through support such as translation, mentoring, provision of dictionaries etc. Progress of pupils with English as an additional language is closely monitored. The ALNCo oversees learning, progress and provision.



MORE ABLE AND TALENTED

The organisation of the school curriculum and the ability banding means that the needs of more able and talented pupils are well met in terms of curriculum delivery. In some cases, more able pupils also access additional qualifications e.g. the top maths set completes GCSE in one year in order to study Further Maths in Y11. Identified more able and talented pupils also have access to occasional activities/ workshops across the Local Authority and EAS Region. Academic progress is closely monitored via target setting and progress checks.
