THE UNIFORM

BLAZER: Learners will be required to wear a **BLACK** school blazer **WITH** the school badge

TIE: All Learners will be required to wear a clip-on tie at all times:
Key Stage 3 – RED stripe; Key Stage 4 – YELLOW stripe;

SHIRT: All pupils will be required to wear a plain white SHIRT this can be long or short sleeved;

JUMPER: All jumpers worn must be **BLACK** V neck **WITH** the school badge

TROUSERS: Tailored black school trousers only-no jeans or leggings

SHORTS: School branded tailored shorts only

SHOES: Plain black leather shoes only; no trainer type shoes or boots

Bags: These should be a rucksack type bag or holdall-no handbag style bags are permitted

Please note, pupils in Key Stage 5 are not required to wear school uniform

For all pupils:

COAT: Pupils will be required to wear ***either*** a **St Martin's coat** or a **PLAIN BLACK** coat; a SMALL logo will be acceptable

JEWELLERY: Discreet jewellery is allowed, no more than a wristwatch, a ring, a bracelet, a chain/necklace (worn under shirt or blouse) and a pair of small earrings.

Choker style necklaces are not acceptable and no other facial jewellery is allowed in school (e.g. nose, tongue, lip or eyebrow studs, including clear studs).

Any jewellery or nail polish must be removed for reasons of health and safety if requested by staff. False/gel nails should be removed if a student is doing any practical subject including but not exclusively science practicals, PE, Design, construction or preparing/cooking food.

HAIRSTYLES Hairstyles which are 'extreme' or attract undue attention are not allowed – e.g. shaven styles or dyed hair (unless natural colour and appearance). It is important to contact your Head of Learning before having a hairstyle which may be considered inappropriate.



SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Hats, caps and other headgear should not be worn on the school site except out of doors as protection from the weather. Students may wear head coverings for religious reasons.

MAKEUP:

Discrete use of makeup is permitted for pupils in key stage 4 and 5 ONLY; false eyelashes or false nails are not permitted
